

Dear Incoming 6th Graders and their families!

It is that time of year where we are responsible for summer math and reading. Mrs. Breault will contact you for exactly what you need to do for the summer reading.

As for math there will be a scheduled weekly posting in Google Classroom on Monday for each week's assignment starting on June 24th, 2024. And each week's module will be due by 8am the following Monday before the new ones are posted. I have attached a flier from XtraMath for your individual child with precise instructions on how to create an account for your student. XtraMath is online flashcards for students to keep their fact family skills where they are (don't want that summer slide to happen) or improve them!!

The schedule will be as following:

For weeks 1-8 we will be doing 3 modules in XtraMath and 1 module in IXL. For weeks 9 & 10 there will be no XtraMath and instead we will double up on the IXL modules.

There will be a document in google classroom for your student to initial when they complete each week's IXL modules. ***You must work to a score of 85 -OR- for 15 minutes** to receive full credit. That is only 30 minutes a week!! This is done so that you are consistently working weekly on honing the skills we worked on so hard this year. If you do not reach 85 or above in the 15-minute window, you will still receive credit for completing it, but this indicates that it is an area you still need to improve in and still need to work on. **THIS WILL COUNT AS YOUR FIRST TEST GRADE OF THE SCHOOL YEAR.** It's a very simple way to start your year off with an A ;)

If you have already completed the module during the school year, YOU NEED TO COMPLETE IT AGAIN. The whole point is to re-practice these concepts. If you do not redo them, they will not show up in your IXL log for the summer, and therefore it will not count towards your grade.

If you are struggling with the math concept of the week look up videos from Math Antics, Mr. J, Khan Academy or Zearn or any YouTube channel. IXL does have the videos to explain a concept too when you get them wrong so read the explanation. Also USE PENCIL AND PAPER when completing the work just like you would for an assignment!
