

Dear Middle School Families!!

Summer is a time to recharge our batteries and refresh ourselves for the upcoming academic year. However, we have all heard of the Summer Slide and in order to counteract that loss of information over the summer months, the middle schoolers are asked to continue to practice certain skills to retain information and not lose what they worked so hard on in Math all year!!

As in years past, in lieu of a Summer Math Packet, the middle school students are being assigned weekly IXL modules, 2 at a time.

**\*You must work to a score of 85 -OR- for 15 minutes** to receive full credit. That is only 30 minutes a week!! This is done so that you are consistently working weekly on honing the skills we worked on so hard this year. If you do not reach 85 or above in the 15-minute window, you will still receive credit for completing it, but this indicates that it is an area you still need to improve in and still need to work on. **THIS WILL COUNT AS YOUR FIRST TEST GRADE OF THE SCHOOL YEAR.** It's a very simple way to start your year off with an A ;)

If you have already completed the module during the school year, YOU NEED TO COMPLETE IT AGAIN. The whole point is to re-practice these concepts. If you do not redo them, they will not show up in your IXL log for the summer, and therefore it will not count towards your grade.

The modules will be posted weekly on MONDAY and are due by 8 am the following Monday before the new ones are posted. This will not start until the week of June 17th and the last will be the week of August 19th to give you the first and last weeks of summer off. This will be a total of 10 weeks with 20 modules.

The last couple of modules will be an introduction to the upcoming year and will be accompanied by an instructional video. This will get your feet wet and ready to go for the start of the year.

If you are struggling at any time with these, feel free to look up videos on Math Antics, Khan, Zearn, or your favorite math YouTube channel. IXL will also explain each time you get something wrong, so pay attention to each incorrect answer. AND USE PAPER AND A PENCIL ;)
